PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS, PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND EMERGENCY PROCEDUR ES:

REMOVE ALL SOURCES OF IGNITION.

FOLLOW SAFE HANDLING ADVICE AND PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT RECOMMENDATIONS.

ENVIRONMENTAL PRECAUTIONS:

DISCHARGE INTO THE ENVIRONMENT MUST BE AVOIDED.

PREVENT FURTHER LEAKAGE OR SPILLAGE IF SAFE TO DO SO.

PREVENT SPREADING OVER A WIDE AREA (E.G. BY CONTAINMENT OR OIL BARRIE RS).

RETAIN AND DISPOSE OF CONTAMINATED WASH WATER.

LOCAL AUTHORITIES SHOULD BE ADVISED IF SIGNIFICANT SPILLAGES CANNOT B

CONTAINED.

METHODS AND MATERIALS FOR CONTAINMENT AND CLEANING UP: NON-SPARKING TOOLS SHOULD BE USED.

SOAK UP WITH INERT ABSORBENT MATERIAL.

SUPPRESS (KNOCK DOWN) GASES/VAPORS/MISTS WITH A WATER SPRAY JET.

FOR LARGE SPILLS, PROVIDE DIKING OR OTHER APPROPRIATE CONTAINMENT TO KEEP

MATERIAL FROM SPREADING. IF DIKED MATERIAL CAN BE PUMPED, STORE RECO VERED

MATERIAL IN APPROPRIATE CONTAINER.

CLEAN UP REMAINING MATERIALS FROM SPILL WITH SUITABLE ABSORBENT.

LOCAL OR NATIONAL REGULATIONS MAY APPLY TO RELEASES AND DISPOSAL OF THIS

MATERIAL, AS WELL AS THOSE MATERIALS AND ITEMS EMPLOYED IN THE CLEA NUP OF

RELEASES. YOU WILL NEED TO DETERMINE WHICH REGULATIONS ARE APPLICAB LE.
